Project Details

The Bribie Island Seaside Museum opened on 14 May 2010, a contemporary museum of history. Nestled in a parkland setting, it enjoys scenic views over the glimmering waters of the Pumicestone Passage in Moreton Bay.

During the preliminary construction phase over 300m³ of asbestos-contaminated land fill was discovered and removed by ICD Group.

The building site also backed onto a local creek that flowed directly into the Pumicestone Passage. ICD Group implemented an Environmental Risk Management Plan that met Moreton Bay Regional Shire Councils stringent environmental requirements and insured that the local community and its pristine environment were not adversely affected during the removal of the contaminated land-fill or construction of the new museum.

ICD Group successfully managed over 20 separate subcontractors to ensure that the museum was delivered on-time, to budget and to the highest possible quality and safety standards.

The new museum is a beacon of excellence for the local community and is a tourist attraction that will bring visitors to the area for many years to come.
